20 Years of History From Family Enterprise to Industry Leader

In this edition of our newsletter we look back at how Study Links has evolved, since its founding in 1998. Study Links was founded as a small family enterprise and has grown to a company that cares for hundreds of students from across the globe each year ensuring they get the best out of their time in the UK.

Acting as guardians themselves Eric and Angela truly enjoyed their work and that they could not give it up. Seeing the success of their work, the value it added to the lives of students, and the gratefulness of parents solidified their resolve to create the UK's leading guardianship team in 1998. Study Links began its life in the Fan family's dining room and for the first few years of the company's existence offered guardianship to students in the Yorkshire area only-working with close family members and trusted friends to provide excellent homestay accommodation for visiting students.

In 2001 two major milestones were reached when Study Links hired a part time secretary named Anne to help Angela and formed a partnership with local transport provider David Rushworth who still provides Study Links with taxis and coaches today!

In 2008 the company grew and a newly converted office was set up to accommodate the team of 7. Four years later the team again grew moved to a purpose built office that was only 5 minutes from the Fan family residence. By this time Study had a staff of 10 full time employees as well as a great network of homestays across the UK and numerous transport partners.

Study Links has come a long way since its humble beginnings of meetings around the Fan's dining room table in 1998. In 2013 Study Links hosted an 'Education in the UK' event at the British Embassy in Beijing. Inviting special guest speakers from within the industry, the event was attended by elite schools, businesses, parents and students from throughout China. Its purpose was to promote the UK's education system and was very well received, resulting in positive press and television coverage.

Today as well as caring for hundreds of students studying in the UK on a short and long term basis, we Study Links also offer students our expertise and help with school and university applications, immersion programmes, arrange agent trips and provide caring and welcoming homestay accommodation. The team has expanded to 11 full time members and 18 support staff that speak a combination of 8 languages.

Although Study Links continues to grow, going from strength to strength, it is still very much stays true to its family values; with the core of those being to always put the student first.
