11th of NOVEMBER
100 YEARS SINCE THE END OF WW1

Sunday the 11th of November marked 100 years since the end of WW1, one of the most destructive wars in human history; seeing 8.5 million people give their lives between 1914 and 1918. Members of the public, military veterans, world leaders and royals took part in memorials around the globe. In the UK many schools were involved in local events to commemorate 'Armistice Day' with students laying wreaths at memorials across the country. The involvement of students in commemorating those who gave their lives was particularly poignant as the Great War claimed the lives of so many of the country's youth including many students aged 16 with the youngest combatant from the UK being recorded as only 12 years old.

In this month's newsletter we would like to remember all those young and old who gave their lives in WW1 and all other conflicts, take a moment to be thankful that our youth today have never had to experience war, and to thank all of our international students who showed their respects on this particularly important Remembrance Day.
